## Train to become a Certified Nurse's Aide (CNA)

Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Milwaukee's Brighter Futures program in partnership with Herzing University is proud to offer a Certified Nurse's Aide training program for high school students. This is a 4-week program and the training meets Wisconsin state and federal program requirements.

As a CNA, students will learn about patient care, anatomy, physiology, infection control, rehabilitation and restorative care, cultural diversity, safety, patient rights, and care for geriatric and dementia patients.

Participants in the CNA Training Program will gain extensive skills including:

- Using Personal Protective Equipment
- Measuring Blood Pressure
- Taking a Radial Pulse
- Measuring Blood Glucose
- Assisting with Undressing & Dressing and Hygiene
- Positioning the Person in Bed
- Caring for the Person with Confusion & Dementia
- Ambulation with Gait Belt
- Assisting with Deep Breathing & Coughing Exercises
- Transferring the Person to a Chair or Wheelchair
- Transferring the Person Using a Mechanical Lift
- Assisting with Range of Motion Exercises
- Applying a Condom Catheter
- Applying Incontinence Products
- Giving Catheter Care

### To be eligible for the program students must be:

- At least 16 years old
- Have at least a 2.5 GPA at the end of their sophomore year OR be a high school graduate OR have a Wonderlic entrance score of 16

### Program Details:

- Classes will run every month
- Students will attend class in person at BGCGM's The Ready Center, 1916 N. Vel R. Phillips Ave., Milwaukee, 53212
  - > There will be weekly required modules and skills training
- Skills and clinical training will be held on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 5:30p.m. to 8:30p.m. at BGCGM's The Ready Center, 1916 N. Vel R. Phillips Ave., Milwaukee, 53212 for four weeks
- In addition to CNA training, additional employment training prep will be held at BGCGM's The Ready Center, 1916 N. Vel R. Phillips Ave., Milwaukee, 53212 for three weeks
- There is no cost for this program, tuition and supplies will be provided
- Students must be vaccinated to begin interning with a medical organization

Upon completion of the program, students will be eligible to sit for the Wisconsin CNA certification written exam and skills test.
